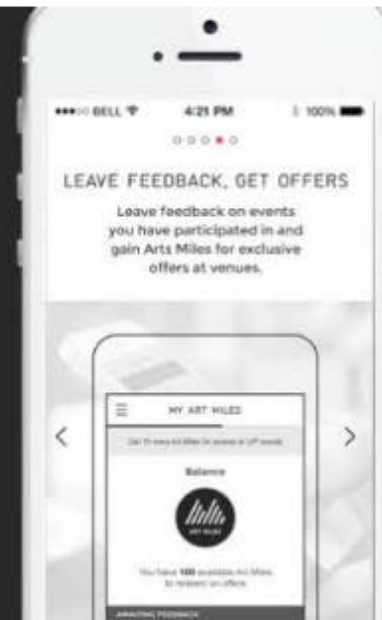

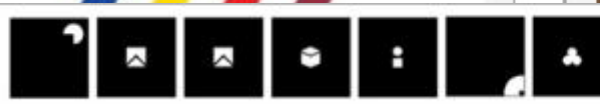
i-DAT is a lab for playful experimentation with data. Located within the Faculty of Arts at Plymouth University, it has been delivering world class cultural activities since 1998.

- London relatively calm after Monday's night of mob violence, arson and looting - many shops and pubs close early and board up windows
- Reports of sporadic trouble in other English cities including Liverpool, Leicester and Nottingham where a police station was firebombed
- Met Police decision to flood London streets with 16,000 officers - many drafted in from other forces - appears to have worked
- No evidence Mark Duggan - whose death sparked first riots on Saturday - opened fire at police, Independent Police Complaints Commission says

The Accident:

3. Events From Initiation Of The T-10 Minute Hold At 23:20 GMT Until The Report Of Fire.

The biomedical data indicate that just prior to the fire report the Senior Pilot was performing essentially no activity (or was in the baseline "rest" condition) until about 23:30:21 GMT when a slight increase in pulse and respiratory rate was noted. At 23:30:30 GMT the electrocardiogram indicates some muscular activity for several seconds. Similar indications are noted at 23:30:39 GMT. The data show increased activity but are not indicative of an alarm type of response. By 23:30:45 GMT, all of the biomedical parameters had reverted to the baseline "rest" level.
